

Nana in the City is about a spunky hip nana who shows her visiting grandson the beauty of city life. Lauren's illustrations are delightful. Her style is simple and pure. You want little eyes to hold these images in their hearts.

Have you ever been to a big city? Or if you live in the city have you been to the country? In this book, the author, Lauren Castillo, has written a book about Nana, a grandmother who lives in the city. Her grandson is coming for a visit, but when he arrives he is overwhelmed by the sights and sounds of the city. His Nana is very wise, and she makes a special cape for him. When you read this story you will discover what happens. Parents/teachers will enjoy reading this book to their children. The children may find this is an opportune time to discuss with the adults some of the fears they may have. They will also be able to discuss what the sights and sounds are in a big city or in the country that may frighten them. The illustrations by Lauren Castillo are bright, vivid and colorful. They depict Nana and her grandson exactly as I would picture them. We can see their adventures. This is such a lovely story, and since I am a Nana, myself, I enjoyed this book immensely. This is a wonderful book that I have shared with Kindergarten students learning about city life. I read it aloud and keep the grandchild gender-neutral. The first-person narrative could be the account of any grandchild with short dark hair. As a school librarian, I always am on the lookout for diverse books, and this story of an active grandparent is a welcome addition to our collection. The Kindergartners loved the story, too, and they discussed how the child's attitudes and feelings changed, even though the narrative text repeated verbatim.

I loved the message of this picture book so much I immediately wanted to share it not only with my young nieces, but also with my dad, who is reluctant to visit me "in the city." While this book is intended for children, the theme of the story is also fun and enjoyable for adults. The author is able

to create a magnificent setting through her vibrant watercolor illustrations. The contrast of color and black and white helps to tell the story from the young boy's point of view. From the illustrations to the succinct but descriptive syntax, the essence of New York City is artfully captured from page to page. I highly recommend this children's book to country dwellers looking to expand their horizons, and to anyone wild enough to live in the city.

I especially love the relationship that the little boy has with his Nana. She is really a neat little lady who instinctively knows kids. This book presents New York City in a nice way to people who have never been there. I like that aspect of the book as well. The illustrations are great with delightful color and texture.
